

Emergency Supply Kit Checklist

Recommended Items to Include in a Basic Emergency Supply Kit:

- Water, one gallon of water per person per day for at least three days, for drinking and sanitation
- Food, at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food (protein bars, peanut butter, canned foods, baby food, etc.)
- Paper plates, plastic or paper cups and plastic utensils
- Manual can opener
- Battery operated radio, preferably a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert and extra batteries
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- First aid kit complete with prescription and over the counter medicines, bandages and gauze, antiseptics, etc.
- Whistle to signal for help
- Bedding including sheets, blankets and pillows
- Clothing
- Dust masks to help filter contaminated air (bandannas may also work)
- Plastic sheeting, garbage bags and duct tape
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities if warranted or requested
- Local maps
- Infant formula and diapers if needed
- Pet supplies including food and water, leash or pet carrier
- Hygiene items such as toilet paper
- Important family documents such as copies of insurance policies, identification and bank account information and home inventory analysis in a waterproof bag or plastic container
- Cash
- Fire Extinguisher
- Matches in a waterproof container
- Books, games, puzzles or other activities for children
